



Suffix “-eer” for job titles



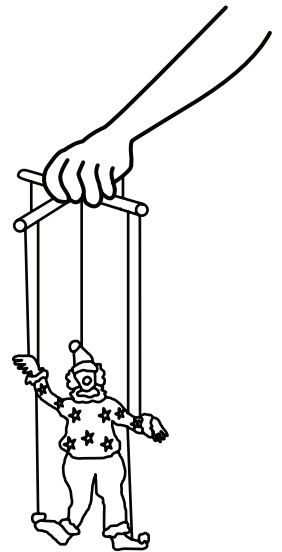
