## **Adverbs of Frequency**

Adverbs of frequency tell us how often or how frequently something happens.

Adverbs of frequency describe how often something occurs, either in definite or indefinite terms.

I <u>always</u> have cereal for breakfast.

I <u>sometimes</u> forget my mother's birthday.

I <u>never</u> drink coffee at night.

I travel overseas annually.

He buys a magazine weekly.

## Adverbs of indefinite frequency

An adverb describing indefinite frequency doesn't specify an exact time.

They include: sometimes, often, and rarely.

I <u>sometimes</u> eat junk food.

I <u>rarely</u> read the newspaper.

I <u>often</u> go for a run.




## Adverbs of definite frequency

Adverbs of definite frequency describe a specific range of time for when something occurs.

They include: hourly, daily, weekly, and yearly.

I run with my dog weekly.

I hold a raffle for charity <u>yearly</u>.
