Metaphors

A metaphor is a figure of speech. It is the comparison of two things to suggest a likeness or similarity.

A metaphor implies that two things are the same in some way.

Take your umbrella because it's *raining cats and dogs*.

This means that the rain is very heavy.

Note that the word "like" is not used. If two things are compared using the word "like", it is a simile not a metaphor.
