Paper Facts

- Paper was developed in China over 2000 years ago.
- Most paper is made from trees, but it can also be made from cotton, wheat straw, sugar cane waste, flax, bamboo, and linen rags.
- Origami is the traditional Japanese art of paper folding. A flat sheet of paper is transformed into sculpture through only folding. No cuts or glues are used.
- Recycling one tonne of paper saves about 17 trees.
- The word 'paper' comes from 'papyrus'. Ancient Egyptians used the papyrus plant as a writing material thousands of years ago.



Paper Folding


How many times can you fold a piece of paper in half?



Number Crunchers


1. Jenny, May, Lily and Jo each made 2 paper cranes.
