### Chameleon facts



Chameleons are lizards found in Africa, Asia, and Europe.

Chameleon means 'Earth Lion'.

Chameleons have a long tongue with a sticky tip on the end to catch their prey.

Their tongues can be longer than their own body length.

A change in light, temperature or emotion can make Chameleons change colour.

Chameleons have unusual eyes. The upper and lower eyelids are joined, with a small hole just large enough for the pupil to see through.

Chameleons can also rotate and focus their eyes separately to observe two different objects simultaneously.

Chameleons have specialized feet to grip tightly to narrow branches.
