## Conjunctions


Conjunctions form a link between one word and another. They are words that join together parts of sentences.

The three most common co-ordinate conjunctions are : *and or but* 

His best sports are golf <u>and</u> tennis.

Jill does not like tea or coffee.

I like fruit, <u>but</u> I don't like oranges.

## **Subordinate Conjunctions**

Subordinate conjunctions join parts of a sentence.

I want to be a pilot <u>when</u> I grow up.

Jan is going to her grandmother's place <u>after</u> school.

Tom has been learning karate <u>since</u> he was five years old.
