Suffixes - 'ed' and 'ing'

A suffix is a letter or group of letters added to the end of a word to change its meaning and form a

new word.

By adding (ed) and (ing) to the word, help, we make helped and helping.

I like to help my mother.

I helped my mother cook dinner.

I am helping my mother cook dinner now.



Suffixes - 'ed' and 'ing'

Adding the suffixes 'ed' and 'ing' can change the tense of a verb.

Jump:

Sue can jump.

Sue jumped into the puddle.

Sue is jumping in the puddle.
