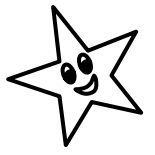




Prefix Origins "di" and "dia"



Adding the prefix "di-" (or "dia-") to a word applies the meaning "through", "thoroughly", "entirely", "across". This prefix has its origins in Greek.
