Adjectives are words that describe nouns or pronouns.

Comparing adjectives compare one noun with another noun.

Often, the comparative form of the adjective is made by adding "er".

For example:

big - bigger Bobby is bigger than Jill.

For most adjectives that end with a 'y', we change the y to i and add er:

easy becomes easier

smelly becomes smellier

happy becomes happier

dirty becomes dirtier

ugly becomes uglier



Freddy is happier than Hoppy.

good – better

little – less

bad – worse

far – farther

The word "than" usually accompanies the comparative.

Taurus is a smaller dog than Rex.

The rooftop garden is <u>lovelier than</u> the foyer.

Venus is <u>brighter than</u> Pluto.

Wendy's hair is <u>shorter than</u> Rhonda's.

The paper plane flew <u>higher than</u> the roof.
